The Bachelor in Urban Sustainability Studies, designed by the Young Universities for the Future of Europe (YUFE) Alliance, offers an innovative, interdisciplinary education to tackle real-life challenges head-on. Customise your learning path, explore diverse landscapes, and lead the way in urban sustainability across Europe with YUFE!

Over three dynamic years, you'll shape your learning journey to match your strengths and interests. The first year covers essential skills at your starting university. In the second and third years, you'll personalise your studies through YUFE Minors and study at a minimum of three different universities across Europe. The programme culminates in a dissertation to showcase your expertise.

Throughout your bachelor's programme, you'll work internationally with students, teachers, and businesses to address real-world issues in a creative, international and interactive setting.

With input from 10 European universities, each a YUFE partner, the programme offers a diverse curriculum that explores sustainability issues in urban and rural settings!


Programme structure

In your first year with YUFE, you'll begin your bachelor's studies at the University of Antwerp (or another chosen university) to build a common foundation in urban sustainability through a mix of on-site and online courses.

As you continue your studies, you have the freedom to personalise your curriculum by choosing from 20 different minors. With this flexibility, you can select three minors, with at least two of them to be taken at other partner universities. This allows you to travel and study at a minimum of three universities, creating a unique and diverse learning experience. The travel is made possible with Erasmus Funding, which provides financial support to help cover the costs of studying abroad, ensuring accessibility to this international academic opportunity.

You'll round off your academic profile with a bachelor's thesis project and your choice of elective courses at your starting university.





^{*} The YUFE university partners apply the 'European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System' (ECTS) in their degree programmes. A full-time one-year study programme is equivalent to 60 ECTS credits (about 30 ECTS credits per semester). One ECTS credit equates to 25 to 30 hours of work including contact hours, preparatory work, study and assessment.

English is widely spoken in Antwerp, though if you learn Dutch during your stay here you will become a local in no time.

As home away from home to over **23,000 students**, the University of Antwerp prides itself on operating on a human scale. Our faculty and staff will welcome you into top-notch infrastructure on one of our four campuses. While you're here you are also invited to enjoy our vibrant cultural programme, sports facilities and many student services.



Admission criteria

To enrol in an academic bachelor's programme at the University of Antwerp, you need to have (at least) a secondary education degree that entitles you to enrol in a comparable programme in a university of the country in which the degree was conferred. For Belgian students this is a secondary education diploma of the Flemish-speaking, French-speaking or German-speaking communities in Belgium.

If your degree has already been recognised by NARIC as equivalent to a Flemish diploma that gives direct access to the programme, then you also meet the diploma requirements.

Since the programme is taught in English, applicants with a prior degree issued outside Belgium, the Netherlands or Luxembourg are required to demonstrate their proficiency in English.

- Applicants can do so by submitting a language certificate showing their TOEFL, IELTS, ITACE or Cambridge English results (the level required can be checked on www.uantwerpen.be/admission).
- Applicants who have **previously obtained** a diploma in an English-taught programme in Australia, English-speaking Canada, Ireland, New Zealand, the United Kingdom and/or the United States of America are exempt from providing an additional language test certificate.
- Applicants with a diploma of a European School or an International Baccalaureate, and English as Language 1 or Level A, should contact the Registrar's Office to have their documents checked for equivalence to the required proficiency in English.

Please note that the Board of Admission may still ask for additional proof of proficiency in English.

Navigating your studies

Academic advisors

Upon enrolment, you'll receive an advisor to help you navigate your academic journey. Your academic advisor will help you select courses, integrate YUFE Minors and electives, and meet your programme goals. Your advisor will guide you in refining academic goals, understanding course connections, and exploring career paths, as well as preparing for master's programmes.

Organising your stay in Antwerp

For incoming international students, the International Students Office at the University of Antwerp can assist you as you prepare for your arrival at our university.

Newsletters on student housing, webinars on costs of living, an app to introduce you to fellow students, and a Welcome Week at the start of the academic year, will help you to find your way in no time.



Organising your stay abroad

As you will be studying at a minimum of two YUFE partners in Europe, you will need to consider the costs and logistics of your stay abroad. How to find student housing and costs of living while doing your minors, will greatly depend on the mobility partners involved. However, all of our partners are strong players in the field of internationalisation within their universities and are well equipped to help you get settled and organised.

Application procedure

Start application at Virtual Campus

You start your application procedure by applying at YUFE Virtual Campus where you can specify your preferred starting university, e.g. the University of Antwerp. You will be asked to demonstrate you meet the entry requirements and will be contacted by a YUFE admission officer to guide you through the application process.

Application deadlines vary according to the starting university. Please check the YUFE Virtual Campus.



Continue your admission and enrolment at your chosen starting university

To start at UAntwerp, Belgian students with a secondary education degree from the Flemish-speaking, French-speaking or German-speaking community, and candidates with a degree mentioned on www.uantwerpen.be/admission can enrol directly as **of 1 July 2025**.

If the degree of secondary education is not mentioned or if you need to apply for a visa, you will need to follow an additional procedure through the online application tool Mobility Online to determine if your degree can be accepted for enrolment and/or to obtain a letter of acceptance required for a visa. Applications for academic year 2025-2026 can be submitted in Mobility Online from early november onwards.

Application deadlines to submit an application through Mobility Online

For non-EEA nationals and for students who need to apply for a visa: **before 1 March 2025**

For EEA nationals: before 1 June 2025
