Whether you're stepping into the shoes of an EU commissioner, parliamentarian, or diplomat, EUROSIM 2025 promises to be an unforgettable journey into the world of European politics.

### **Guided Tour of the Red Star Line Museum**

Two million passengers made the crossing from Antwerp to North America aboard the steamships of the Red Star Line. Their story, that of the shipping company that transported them and that of the city and the port from which they departed, are central to the Red Star Line Museum's main exhibition. The museum poses the question of what this history means today. Migration and human mobility are issues that have been relevant throughout history: millions of people all over the world have left (and are leaving) behind what is familiar in order to look elsewhere for a new future. In the Red Star Line Museum you follow the path of the emigrants. From their departure from their country of origin, through their long journey and their temporary stay in Antwerp, to the crossing and their arrival in their new homeland of America or Canada.

The emigrants that boarded in Antwerp mainly came from far off regions. They had already completed a long journey before arriving at the Red Star Line buildings. During a 1,5 hour guided tour of the museum (in English; in small groups), you will experience the trip – through their stories – as if you were one of them.

# **About Your Host**

If you arrived in Antwerp by train, you may have passed by the <u>Antwerp Zoo</u> without even knowing it. Next to the Antwerp Central Station, which is an architectural masterpiece in its own right, lies the Antwerp Zoo. It is one of the oldest and most famous zoos in Europe and offers an oasis of calm in the heart of the city. The beautiful gardens, the characterful listed buildings and, of course, the animals: it is the perfect setting for a fun outing.

As the home of Pieter Paul Rubens, Antwerp has its fair share of cultural destinations and museums worth visiting. The Rubens House is where Pieter Paul Rubens, one of the most famous Baroque artists of the 17th century, lived and worked. Visit the Rubens Experience, the library, and the colourful redesigned garden. The home of the historic artist is temporarily closed for restoration. In addition, you can encounter the work of Rubens in several other places in Antwerp, such as the <u>Plantin-Moretus Museum</u> (UNESCO World Heritage site), the Royal Museum of Fine Arts Antwerp, and the Cathedral of Our Lady. Especially the Royal Museum of Fine Arts Antwerp (KMSKA) is an absolute must-do, where you can admire a beautifully renovated building and discover seven centuries of the finest art in a completely new setting. This palace of the arts is home to a staggering collection of over 13,000 pieces. Among them are works by many great historic European painters, including Rubens, James Ensor, Jan van Eyck, Pierre Alechinsky and many, oh so many more. The KMSKA is located in the Zuid neighbourhood, one of Antwerp's nicest neighbourhoods, with wide avenues, stately townhouses, lovely squares, interesting shops and a number of world-

class museums. Thanks to the many cafes and restaurants, there are also plenty of places where you can have a drink or something to eat.



In the old city centre stands the <u>Cathedral of Our Lady</u>, a monumental building that has graced the Antwerp skyline since the beginning of the 14th century. The cathedral's architecture is gothic, while its interior is baroque. And that is definitely due to Rubens and four of his masterpieces that may be found here. Another church worth visiting is the <u>St. Charles Borromeo</u> <u>Church</u>, which is sometimes considered the essential Rubens church with both paintings and sculptural works from his hand. Located on the picturesque Hendrik Conscienceplein, this triumphant baroque church is certainly an eye-catcher.

Another place worth visiting is Antwerp's iconic <u>Grote Markt</u>. You can admire the beautiful renaissance Town Hall (UNESCO World Heritage site) and the countless 16thcentury guild houses, and enjoy a drink on one of the many terraces. Another must-see in the square is the impressive Brabo Fountain, depicting the legend from which Antwerp is said to have derived its name (see this brochure's cover picture). Near the Grote Markt, look for the hidden, picturesque <u>Vlaeykensgang</u>, a medieval alley that transports you into another era. If you head towards the river, you will encounter the medieval castle <u>Het Steen</u>, currently a tourist information centre

Het Eilandje (Little Island), so-called because it is surrounded by water, has long had a reputation as one of Antwerp's coolest neighbourhoods. It breathes water and exudes charm with its monumental warehouses, lanterns, and cobblestones. A focal point of the neighbourhood is the stately Museum aan de <u>Stroom</u>, or MAS. This city museum is well worth a visit in itself, and its breathtaking rooftop panorama doubly so. Visit the rooftop (free access!) at sunset for an ultimate other-worldly view of the city, the river and the port. You can also explore the area's many culinary hotspots. In addition, the many pubs and cafés in this area are perfect places to familiarise yourself with that other great Belgian heritage item: beer. You may want to order a glass of De Koninck, the local brew. One (or several) of these 'bollekes' will assure you of a good night's sleep. Side note: Belgian beers tend to be higher in alcohol than most beers from other countries, so drink wisely and responsibly.

Finally, venture a little more to the north to encounter another highlight: the <u>Port House</u>. The structure houses the headquarters of Antwerp's Port Authority, which manages one of the largest ports in Europe. This modern icon, where a sparkling diamond is perched on top of an old fire station, was

created by architect Zaha Hadid. The stunning structure soon became a city landmark, an instantly recognisable part of the skyline.

# **Getting Around**

### **Public transport: Trams and buses**

Antwerp has a dense public transportation network. Buses and trams are available to take you to different parts of the city. A single ticket within the city is  $\leq 2.5$  and allows you to use public transportation (buses and trams) for one hour. You can consider buying a *De Lijn* card (10 rides for  $\leq 17$ ), a day of unlimited travel ( $\leq 7.50$ ) or a 3-day ticket ( $\leq 15$ ). Tickets can be purchased in advance via de app, the <u>website</u> or at the <u>sales points in the city</u>. On all buses and trams of De Lijn you can also pay for your ticket 'contactless' via the white terminal, by using your contactless bank card (Maestro, Mastercard, VPAY and Visa), payment apps (Apple Pay, Google Pay), or wearables (Fitbit Pay, Garmin Pay).

### **Cycling and scooting**

Antwerp is a bike-friendly city. The distances are not too large, the bike lanes are flat and with the right gear, you can cycle all year round.



<u>Velo</u> is Antwerp's metropolitan bike scheme. There are check-in and dropoff zones of the city bikes throughout the entire city. To ride Velo you have to register beforehand. You can buy a day pass for  $\in$ 5 or a week pass for  $\in$ 12. After purchasing a day or week pass, you can use the bikes for a maximum of 30 minutes per session. **Donkey Republic** is a bike rental service. It offers normal and electric bikes; short or long bike rentals and you pay as you go via the app. Find more information on <u>www.donkey.bike/cities/bike-rental-antwerp/.</u>

In Antwerp we have **shared electric scooters** from <u>Voi</u>, <u>Lime</u> and <u>Poppy</u>. They all work with a freefloating system, meaning that they do not have a fixed parking spot, but can be found scattered throughout the city. To use a scooter, you must first download the Voi, Lime or Poppy app. Use the app to find the closest scooter and scan the QR code. After your journey, leave the scooter in a place where it cannot obstruct traffic and end your journey in the app.
