

Arrival checklist

Pre-departure

1. Confirm accommodation

Ensure your accommodation is ready and that you have all necessary details:

- Address
- Contact person
- Keys or access codes

2. Arrange transportation

Plan your route from the airport to your accommodation:

- Taxi or public transport options
- Directions to your accommodation

3. Credit card/cash

- Have some local currency for immediate expenses, such as taxi fare

4. Travel insurance

- Make sure you have valid travel insurance

5. Health insurance

- EEA students: bring your European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) card as proof of health insurance. Non-EEA students must arrange Belgian insurance when they arrive in Antwerp.

Upon arrival

Airport formalities

1. Customs and immigration

- Keep your passport, visa, and necessary documents ready for inspection

2. Buy a SIM card

- Purchase a local SIM card to stay connected. [Check the telecom provider overview.](#)

First few days

Settle into accommodation

1. **Inspect your space**
 - Check the condition of your room or apartment and report any issues
2. **Basic necessities**
 - Locate nearby shops and supermarkets to buy groceries, toiletries, and other essentials

Attend welcome week

- Participate in the university's Welcome Week activities to get oriented

Administrative tasks

1. **University enrolment**
 - Complete [the enrolment procedure](#) if you haven't done so already
2. **Course enrolment**
 - Register your courses and put together your timetable in SisA
3. **Tuition fee payment**
 - Pay your tuition fee as soon as possible
4. **Apply for a residence permit**
 - The Residence Permit Office assists with your application. [Check the procedure online.](#)
5. **Arrange health insurance**
 - Non-EEA students can explore health insurance options during the Welcome Week and sign up as soon as possible
6. **Open a bank account**
 - Set up a local bank account for convenient financial transactions. [Consult the webpage and manual for more information.](#)

7. Save emergency contacts

- Add important contacts to your phone, including university and local emergency services. The emergency number is **112**.
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Explore the local area

1. Local healthcare

- Identify the nearest hospital or general practitioner

2. Public transport
