<u>MSCA Postdoctoral Fellowships</u> are individual research grants offering excellent <u>postdoctoral</u> <u>researchers</u> the chance to develop their skills by means of international mobility. Through the implementation of an original and personalised research project, MSCA Postdoctoral Fellowships aim to foster excellence through <u>training and mobility</u> and to equip researchers with new skills and competences in order to identify solutions to current and future challenges.

The Department of Constitutional Law at Nicolaus Copernicus University in Toruń invites motivated postdoctoral researchers to jointly prepare an application for the <u>MSCA-PF-2022 call</u> <u>Marie</u> <u>Skłodowska-Curie Postdoctoral Fellowships</u> call (<u>MSCA-PF-2022</u>) with them as host organisation.

Description of Hosting organisation/group

The Department of Constitutional Law is one of the leading centres in Poland dealing with comparative constitutional law. For years the Department's employees have been cooperating with leading academic centres from Italy (LUISS Guido Carli, Roma Tor Vergata, Università degli Studi di Macerata or Università Ca' Foscari Venezia), the Czech Republic (Charles University in Prague and Palacky University in Olomouc), Slovakia (Comenius University in Bratislava), Hungary (Pazmany Peter Catholic University) or Japan (Kobe University). In addition, the Department staff participated as investigators in the project "Security in V4 constitutions and political practices", founded by the Visegrad Fund (Standard Grant No. 21510444, implemented in 2015-2016) and currently in the research project "BETKOSOL - Better Knowledge for Better Solutions", founded by the European Union's Hercule III Programme. Currently, Chair staff are involved in the project Responding to Emerging Dissensus: Supranational Instruments & Norms of European Liberal Democracy (RED-SPINEL), selected for funding under the Horizon Europe Programme.

You must have a completed PhD at the time of the call deadline (14 September 2022).

Candidates must have a maximum of 8 years full-time research experience from the PhD award date until September 14, 2022. Periods of inactivity in research (e.g. unemployment, periods of employment outside research, parental or sick leave) do not count towards the time of research experience.

For European fellowships, candidates can be of any nationality and must not have resided or carried out their main activity (work, studies, etc.) in Poland for more than 12 months in the 36 months immediately before September 14, 2022.

Highly motivated candidate with an excellent research track record appropriate to career stage, as evidenced by academic publications and other scientific output.
