

Hosting offer for Marie Sklodowska-Curie Postdoctoral Fellowships (PF) 2022 at GOVTRUST Centre of Excellence

<u>MSCA Postdoctoral Fellowships</u> are individual research grants offering excellent <u>postdoctoral</u> researchers the chance to develop their skills by means of international mobility. Through the implementation of an original and personalised research project, MSCA Postdoctoral Fellowships aim to foster excellence through training and mobility and to equip researchers with new skills and competences in order to identify solutions to current and future challenges.

The GOVTRUST Centre of Excellence invites motivated postdoctoral researchers to jointly prepare an application for the <u>MSCA-PF-2022 call</u> <u>Marie Skłodowska-Curie Postdoctoral Fellowships</u> call (<u>MSCA-PF-2022</u>) with them as host organisation.

Description of Hosting organisation/group

The GOVTRUST Centre of Excellence is an interdisciplinary research consortium focusing on "Trust and Distrust in Multi-level Governance". GOVTRUST combines high-level scientific expertise of three faculties (Law, Social Sciences and Economics) and five disciplines (political science, communication science, law, behavioural economics and public administration) to jointly conduct frontline interdisciplinary research on the dynamics, causes and effects of trust and distrust in multi-level governance systems. In particular, GOVTRUST studies the trust relations between political, administrative, regulatory, and judicial actors as well as trust in and of citizens and society. GOVTRUST aims to maximize scientific impact combined with a substantial societal impact.

Since the start of GOVTRUST in Spring 2020, GOVTRUST has been very active in **acquiring** or participating in **international and interuniversity research projects, including MSCA Fellowships and several other EU grants** (e.g. <u>TiGRE</u> on 'Trust in Governance and Regulation in Europe', <u>ERA-NET</u> <u>CONTRA</u> on 'Conflict in Transformations', <u>@ntidote</u> on 'Cyberviolence permissibility and accountability', <u>PLATO ITN</u> on 'The Post-Crisis Legitimacy of the EU', <u>TROPICO</u> on 'Transforming into Open, Innovative and Collaborative Governments' and MSCA-IF REGTRUST on 'How nature of regulation and levels of trust affect each other over time'). We also have a rich experience in other collaborative research projects and proposal writing, development of innovative methodologies, as well as establishing strong links between research outcomes and the ongoing policy discourse.

Your profile

- Expected qualifications/expertise of the candidate: background in the broad area of 'trust and distrust in multi-level governance' or related subjects, researchers from the fields of political science, communication science, law, behavioural economics and public administration
- You must have a completed PhD at the time of the call deadline (14 September 2022).
- Candidates must have a maximum of 8 years full-time research experience from the PhD award date until September 14, 2022. Periods of inactivity in research (e.g. unemployment, periods of employment outside research, parental or sick leave) do not count towards the time of research experience.
- For European fellowships, candidates can be of any nationality and must not have resided or carried out their main activity (work, studies, etc.) in Belgium for more than 12 months in the 36 months immediately before September 14, 2022.
- Highly motivated candidate with an excellent research track record appropriate to career stage, as evidenced by academic publications and other scientific output.

- A stimulating, interdisciplinary environment for high-level research.
