



Provisional Medicine curriculum 2026 – 2027 for exchange students

Dear exchange student

Thank you for your interest in the medicine programme of the Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences of the University of Antwerp. The tables and schedules below will help you to draft your personal study programme at our university. Before doing this please pay close attention to following important rules and guidelines:

- **We DO NOT offer an English programme.** Only a limited number of courses are taught in English (**green courses**). Other courses are taught in Dutch, but are available to exchange students (**yellow courses**).
- As an exchange student you are allowed to register for courses of the 3rd Bachelor (3rd year), 1st Master (4th year) and 2nd Master (5th year). However, **try to avoid choosing ‘overlapping courses’**. These are courses that are taught at the same time in different years. The reason is that several professors expect students to be present in their classes. Moreover, the exam dates of these courses might overlap as well.
- As an exchange student **you cannot enroll in all courses of the Medicine curriculum of the UAntwerp**. Only the courses indicated in **yellow** and **green** in the schedule on page 4 are available to exchange students. All other courses are not available unless you can prove your Dutch language skills (level B2).
 - o Courses indicated in **GREEN** are **TAUGHT IN ENGLISH** and are **available to ALL exchange students**. Study material, Powerpoint slides, exams, etc. are available in English.
 - o Courses indicated in **YELLOW** are courses with facilities for exchange students and are **available to ALL exchange students**. These courses are **TAUGHT IN DUTCH**, but there are **facilities in English** (e.g. textbook, Powerpoint slides, assignment sheets, individual work, ...). Which facilities are available in English depends on the lecturer of the course. The examination of these courses is **always** available in English.
- It is **not possible** to enroll in a course of the first semester and to do the exam in the second semester, and vice-versa.
- In principle students need to take up **30 credits per semester**. We strongly advise exchange students to sign up for a **minimum of 21 credits**.
- **Clinical traineeships** in the hospital can take place in semester 1 or semester 2 depending on the availability in the hospital. A traineeship requires your full-time presence (ca. 40 hours/week) during at least 4 weeks. Hence, it is **not possible** to attend courses during those weeks. Only when there is a gap in your study programme (and when this gap corresponds with the rotation system in the hospital), you can do a traineeship. **There is only 1 deadline per year to apply for a traineeship in the hospital.**

General remarks about the Elective Courses:

- **This is a provisional list! Final elective topics will be communicated at the start of the academic year.** Changes can be made until the beginning of October for the first semester (autumn) and the beginning of February for the second semester (spring).
- You need to choose **a combination of TWO minors OR ONE major**. Hence, you need to choose two minors or one major to obtain the total amount of credits of **3 ECTS**. You cannot only choose one minor (1,5 ECTS).
- All **“A” courses** are taught on the same days during the elective week. The exams of these courses are also organized on the same day. The same goes for **“B” courses**. **It is therefore recommended to choose one A and one B minor course, instead of two A minor courses.** The latter is possible, but then you have lessons on the same day and also the exam is scheduled on the same day.
- In order to obtain the ECTS credits for **Elective Course 1** and **Elective Course 2** you need to **pass the exams of all topics** chosen. Passing only one exam will **not** result in half the amount of credits.

TRY TO AVOID OVERLAPPING COURSES IN LEARNING AGREEMENTS (e.g. Locomotor System 2 and Abdomen 2: Uro & Gynaeco).

Green courses = available to all exchange students. Courses, study material and/or examinations in English.

Yellow courses = Courses taught in Dutch, but facilities (study material, examinations, ppt slides, ...) in English for exchange students.
