

What and why?



What exactly is Open Access? (OA)



- Free and open online access to academic output
- No financial, legal or technical barriers to accessing it
- Term usually encompasses written output
- Use permitted → Open license
 - Reading
 - Downloading
 - Copying
 - Use in education



Why?

Practical answer:

- 1. Open Access Policy UA
- 2. Open Access Policy Funders

Additionally:

- 1. More transparency
- 2. Easier access to your work
- 3. More exposure



The University of Antwerp Open Access Policy



"The UAntwerp OA policy implies that all UAntwerp authors are obliged to include the PDF of either the final author version or an open access publisher's version when reporting a peer reviewed article for inclusion in the institutional repository."

Submitted final author's versions of journal articles will be made open access available according to the publisher copyright policy and/or the Belgian Open Access regulation.

 - Journal Articles
 - Preprints
 - Books and book chapters

 - ...







The publication process

Traditional publishing







Publishing is not free!

- Publishing involves costs:
 - Website, platform, copy-edit, distribution, ...

- The difference is who pays for it
 - The author ('Article Processing Charges' = APC's)
 - The reader (subscriptions)
 - Third parties (sponsoring, grants,...)



Things to check before submitting

- Any APC's need to be payed after acceptance of the article
 - BUT you need to know what the cost will be before submitting!
- So, before submitting:
 - Check journal type (APC based? Free Open Access? Closed?)
 - If a cost is involved, check with your promotor!
 - Check licensing options
 - Check reliability of the journal (non-predatory)!








Article Publishing Charge

As an open access journal with no subscription charges, a fee (Article Publishing Charge, APC) is payable by the author or research funder to cover the costs associated with publication. This ensures your article will be immediately and permanently free to access by everyone. The Article Publishing Charge for this journal is:

Article type	Article Publishing Charge (excl. taxes)
Full length articles	USD 1460
Short articles	USD 550




Green OA – Belgian legislation




- Author has the right to publish Open Access
- When publicly funded (>= 50%)
- Scholarly articles, not books/chapters/proceedings in books/...
- Applies to the AAM, published version ONLY when agreed by publisher
- Original source has to be cited
- Embargo needs to be respected
- Publisher cannot oppose this
- Works retroactively
- Any link to Belgium (funding, scientist, institute)





How to upload your papers in the repository?

- https://repository.uantwerpen.be
 - My account > create and/or connect an ORCID
 - My bibliography > submit a publication

Web of Science import

- Articles indexed in web of science are added automatically to the repository
- If the publisher's version is not available or cannot (yet) be disclosed via the IR, the corresponding author, respectively the first UAntwerp author in line, will be asked to send a final peer reviewed author's version to the helpdesk of the library.

Retro-actively submitting PDF's

Final author's versions and/or publisher's versions of publications published before 2014 can be imported into the institutional repository. The author sends a message with a PDF to the library helpdesk including an identification of the record to be completed.



Rights Retention Strategy (RRS)

Some funders, like Horizon Europe, need you to publish immediate OA

- RRS is developed by cOAlition S based on simple principles
 - The accepted manuscript = intellectual creation of the author
 - The author adds CC-BY license to accepted manuscript = claim ownership
 - The publisher → no ownership of the accepted manuscript
 - Publishers → can have the right to published version of the manuscript



Rights Retention Strategy



How?

Notify publisher when submitting

\rightarrow Example:

"This work was funded by the European Union under the Horizon Europe grant [grant number]. As set out in the Grant Agreement, beneficiaries must ensure that at the latest at the time of publication, open access is provided via a trusted repository to the published version or the final peer-reviewed manuscript accepted for publication under the latest available version of the Creative Commons Attribution International Public Licence (CC BY) or a licence with equivalent rights. CC BY-NC, CC BY-ND, CC BY-ND or equivalent licenses could be applied to long-text formats."

- On publication: make accepted version Open Access in a repository with a CC-By license
- 3. Contact funder in case of disagreement


Open Licenses

An open license allows for reuse of the article

- In Gold, Hybrid and Diamond OA, this is usually the case
- Usually Creative Commons Licenses
- Publisher often gives you the option between some licenses



All articles published open access will be immediately and permanently free for everyone to read, download, copy and distribute. Permitted reuse is defined by your choice of one of the following user licenses:

Creative Commons Attribution (CC BY): lets others distribute and copy the article, to create extracts, abstracts, and other revised versions, adaptations or derivative works of or from an article (such as a translation), to include in a collective work (such as an anthology), to text or data mine the article, even for commercial purposes, as long as they credit the author(s), do not represent the author as endorsing their adaptation of the article, and do not modify the article in such a way as to damage the author's honor or reputation.

Creative Commons Attribution-NonCommercial-NoDerivs (CC BY-NC-ND): for noncommercial purposes, lets others distribute and copy the article, and to include in a collective work (such as an anthology), as long as they credit the author(s) and provided they do not alter or modify the article.



Open Licenses – Funder requirements

- Some funders require a specific license!
- Status in 2023 (ALWAYS CHECK!):
- Horizon Europe:
 - immediate OA (Green only with Rights Retention Strategy)
 - No Hybrid journal APC's will be funded
 - CC BY (articles)
 - CC BY-NC OR CC BY-ND (monographs)
- Belspo:
 - Green OA = ok
 - CC BY (articles published OA)
 - CC BY-NC-SA OR CC BY (monographs)
- FWO:
 - No formal license, but in between the lines CC BY for articles





Reliability of publishers



Predatory journals

Predatory journals trick you!

Charge for publication without having the necessary quality assurance

For example:

- No peer review
- Bad peer review
- Suddenly ask for higher publishing fee
- Don't publish your paper at all





Where?

- Preprint servers e.g. medRxiv, arXiv, bioRxiv, F1000, SSRN, ...
- Google scholar
- Pubmed (preprint pilot 2020)













Be careful: Possibly different versions of 1 publication

• Reference list: state which version you've consulted!

- Lack of peer review: possibly dangerous or non-scientific content
- Be very careful when applying for a patent
- Not all journals accept papers that have been submitted to a preprint server → has become rare
- (Risk of misinterpretation and miscommunication)

Book Publications

Publishing a book Open Access for free is generally less easy, because e.g.
 the Belgian OA legislation does not support it (no Green OA)


There are discipline-specific Diamond OA monograph publishers

We do not have OA book publish deals at our university

How to finance an Open Access publication?

- Always discuss this with your promotor first!
- Free options: Green and Diamond Open Access
- Journals with APC's:
 - Special issues sometimes grant waivers
 - We might have a publish deal, check:

<u>Cambridge</u> <u>University Press</u>	Read & Publish deal 2022-2024: no APC for corresponding/first authors in all Open Access journals (Gold or Hybrid)
MDPI	Institutional Open Access Program: 10% discount on APC in all journals
