






Figure 1: Share of PhD holders per non-academic sector in their first job after obtaining a PhD, 2017 (N = 1535)




What skills are you obtaining by doing your PhD?

Developing hypotheses and searching for innovative solutions	Creative thinking
Supervising PhD researchers or master students	Leadership/coaching
Synthesizing large amounts of information	Analytical thinking




