REAL GOVERNANCE IN KINSHASA

Kristof Titeca, Albert Malukisa Nkuku and Stylianos Moshonas

Abstract

How do people relate to dominant political and economic structures in Kinshasa: how do they navigate these pressures,



contest them, and/or become part of them? In doing so, it unpacks the various ways in which people make use of personal connections ('branchement'), and what this tells us about the nature of the state and governance in Kinshasa. The project does so by looking at a number of spaces, in particular the transportation- and police-services (the street spaces); markets (the market spaces), soccer (spaces of pleasure), urban planning (the city space), the health sector and civil servants (the state spaces). In doing so, the project analyses the interaction between broader structural circumstances and the agency of the wider population – in other words, the "resourcefulness, inventiveness, and determination" (Murray and Myers 2006: 2) of urban residents in the light of political and economic structures beyond their control.
