PRECONFERENCE ON THE SCHOOL SUCCESS OF YOUNGSTERS OF IMMIGRANT ORIGIN IN QUEBEC AND FLANDERS

WEDNESDAY 20 NOVEMBER 2013

The preconference takes place in the context of the workshop: 'Youth, Education and Value Change: The School as Keeper of the Social Status-quo or a Platform to Explore Values'? which is organized by the University Centre Saint-Ignatius Antwerp together with members of CeMIS, the Centre for Migration and Intercultural Studies of the University of Antwerp.

The preconference is co-organized with the financial support of the Ministry of International Relations of Quebec and the Gülen Chair for Intercultural Studies in Flanders. Following research centres are involved in the organization of the programme:

1. Objectives

dissemination of the results of two research projects on the school success of youngsters with an immigrant background in Quebec (Canada) and in Flanders (the semi-autonomous Dutch speaking and northern part of Belgium). The research project in Quebec is based on a meta-analysis of 15 quantitative studies, focusing on the educational pathways and performance of youngsters of immigrant origin, and factors that influence these. A synthesis of the team's very diverse qualitative work will also be presented. In this regard, special attention is given to features that administrative data does not cover, or at least not sufficiently, among other things to family and community strategies, to school-family- community relations, to systemic factors that may hamper the success of students from certain communities, as well as to innovative practices worth promoting.

The research project 'Bet You - Boosting the Educational Trajectories of YOUth in Flanders' studied the school careers of pupils of Polish, Chinese, Moroccan or Turkish origin as well as native Flemish pupils in secondary education. Pupils were studied in their school environment as well as in their home environment and during their leisure time or afterschool activities. This project ran from January 2009 till December 2012 and was based on quantitative and qualitative research methods. See: www.oprit14.be
