In the History Master's program, you'll embark on an international excursion based on your chosen specialization.



## Urban History: Kraków

You will dive into the experience of the fascinating city of Kraków and expand your understanding of urban history.

During a one-week workshop led by Belgian and Polish supervisors of Jagiellonian University you will deal with diverse themes such as environmental pollution, war, migration, social inequality, housing, and segregation. Last year the excursion centered on how Kraków and its residents coped with "crisis".



Explore Kraków's various historical dimensions: the old city center, the Jewish quarter Kazimierz, the Wawel Castle and the utopian socialist town Nowa Huta



## Political History: Bosnia and Herzegovina or Thessaloniki

As part of the Political History Lab master students do a 5 day excursion either to Bosnia-Herzegovina or Greece. In both countries many regimes succeeded each other, leaving traces in the material, social, cultural, and political landscape.

**In 2024 we will venture once again to Thessaloniki:**

The students are in charge of guided tours through the city and receive a crash course by local specialists of the Aristotle University. Some highlights: the birthplace of Atatürk, the Jewish Museum, the Byzantine Acropolis, the Roman Palace of Galerius, the Hamza Bey Mosque.
