09u30 - 12u00	<p><b>OPTION 3: A Rapid Framework for Interdisciplinary Alignment and Mutual Understanding</b></p> <p>An intensive workshop for postdoctoral researchers to explore working across disciplinary boundaries'</p> <p>In this fast-paced, interactive workshop, postdocs from diverse disciplines are paired up to engage in a "pressure-cooker" style interdisciplinary reflection exercise. Without prior acquaintance, each pair navigates a structured series of short, intensive activities designed to reveal how experts from different fields think, communicate, and approach problems. Through guided prompts, rapid co-creation tasks, and facilitated reflection moments, participants experience firsthand the process of aligning perspectives, bridging disciplinary assumptions, and building a shared vocabulary. <b>15u15 - 15u45</b>	<p><b>Keynote ‘Relational Leadership for Academics: Leading Without Losing Yourself or Others’</b></p> <p>Academics often lead without explicitly taking up a leadership role: they supervise students, coordinate projects, and navigate complex team dynamics. Yet leadership in academia is rarely made explicit or reflective. In this talk, I invite participants to pause and reflect on how they (wish to) lead, and on whether their leadership style fits both who they are and the people they work with.</p> <p>Drawing on research on prestige- and dominance-based leadership, psychological empowerment, and interpersonal relations dynamics, I explore why effective leadership is not primarily about control or charisma, but about flexibility, relational awareness, and fit. I approach leadership as a relational practice: shaped by how we position ourselves in interaction, and by how we communicate with and respond to others.</p> <p>Participants are invited to reflect on their own (desired) leadership patterns and will be offered concrete prompts and exercises to help them develop a leadership style that is both effective and sustainable for themselves and for those around them.</p> <p><i>Prof. Charlotte De Backer</i></p>		F.
