



PAX Moot Court is an international mooting competition focused on Transnational Private International Law.

In this competition, students learn how to operate with EU Regulations and international treaties that apply across different jurisdictions and should ideally receive a uniform interpretation.

The Moot Court consists of two phases, a written and an oral one.

Teams are given a case geared towards Private International Law questions (jurisdiction, choice of law or recognition and enforcement issues), and students have the opportunity to learn and apply first-hand the complexities and nuances of how international conventions and EU Regulations interact in the context of transnational litigation.

In the oral phase, Moot teams plead before renowned judges, academics and practicing lawyers in Private International Law.

The 2025 edition involved 34 teams in the oral rounds held in Maastricht with a total of 134 students coming from 26 EU and 8 non-EU states.
