Best practice: e-CMR from paper to paperless


e-CMR replaces the paper version of the Contract for the International Carriage of goods by Road.


e-CMR is an innovation that helps supply chain stakeholders to better integrated their administrative processes.

e-CMR is an example of "disruptive innovation" in the digital transformation of the supply chain.

The digital bill is stored in the cloud and can be consulted by each supply chain party.







e-CMR

First introduction: IRU, ASTIC in Spain and FNTR in France organized a first e-CMR transport in January 2017.

Present: Currently expanding in Europe



Functionalities:

e-CMR available via the APCS portal.

Sign on glass for the e-CMR receiving party.

Free download DIGICMR app from Google play.

Benefits:

Reduced costs: ex. labour and administration costs (aprox. 6.21 Euros per document, Dutch Minister of Economic Affairs)

Improved productivity in logistic processes (reduce dwell time) and value-added services.

e-Bill of lading

First introduction: SeaDocs project (1986) initiated by INTERTANKO in collaboration with *Chase Manhattan bank.*

Present:

Mostly used in shipping industry for: tankers, bulkers, barges & liner
